John is the Director of Music at Faith Lutheran Church in Morris and also instructs 'Teaching Music K-12' to senior music education majors at the University of Minnesota-Morris.

Outside his busy music schedule, John enjoys volleyball, reading and gardening. The 'love of his life' is his wife, Lisa and their children, Alyna, Joseph, and Samuel. Coincidentally, John, tenor and Lisa, soprano, met while singing together in Chorale for several seasons in the early 1990s. Great PAC memories include the Chorale tour to England in 1993.
